As the Russian military invasion of Ukraine is ongoing, with no solution in sight, the three Russian candidates, which were nominated and are part of the candidates' brochure, will not be presenting in Tartu, as they will be included in the European Museum Forum's sanctions, coming into effect by May 1st, 2022, barring participation of candidate museums and professionals from Russia from the EMYA 2022 conference and award ceremony as well as from candidacy for EMYA 2023.
